

 **WHAT IS IT? (RATIONALE)**

Knowing how to talk to and listen to people is part of what makes us social beings. It is one of the most important things we can learn in school because most of technology does not enhance the social aspects of speaking and listening.

 **GETTING STARTED (PROCEDURES & MATERIALS)**

The students will sit at their desks. They will each be assigned a letter of the alphabet by the teacher. One student will be picked to go around and ask a student his/her letter. Together they will then go to another student to find out his/her letter. They will continue until they can spell a word. Then, another person will begin a new word. Students will never say anything outloud; therefore no one will know in advance what letters anyone else has or what word is being formed.

Alphabet cards may be used.

 **ADAPTATIONS**

Have each student receive two letters and then as students go around the classroom they have to choose one of the two letters to add to their word.
