F. Sexual Decision Making: <i>Includes developing skills such as communication, assertiveness, refusal, and negotiation skills for sexual decision-making.</i>															
G. Pregnancy and Childbirth: <i>Explains how pregnancy occurs, the importance of prenatal care, and the birth of babies.</i>															
H. Parenting Responsibilities: <i>Explores physical, emotional, social, and economic responsibilities of parenting and impact on future goals.</i>															
I. Abstinence: <i>Discusses reasons for not having sexual intercourse and develops skills (e.g., communication and refusal) for being abstinent.</i>															
J. Sexually Transmitted Diseases (including HIV/AIDS): <i>Includes information about the transmission, symptoms, treatment, and prevention of sexually transmitted diseases such as HIV/AIDS, herpes, and syphilis.</i>															
K. Risk Reduction: <i>Provides information about condoms as a means to reduce risk for HIV and other sexually transmitted diseases.</i>															
L. Contraception: <i>Provides information about birth control methods such as abstinence, condoms, birth control pills, and Depo-Provera and their roles in preventing pregnancy.</i>															
M. Sexual Orientation/Identity: <i>Teaches that some students self-identify or are perceived to be gay, lesbian, or bisexual and that all students deserve to be treated with respect (i.e., no name-calling, taunting, bullying).</i>															
N. Sexual Abuse, Rape, and Sexual Assault: <i>Provides information about forced sexual activity and ways to prevent it, the laws, and where to go for help.</i>
